Important Information:

- Your daughter **MUST** be a registered Girl Scout for the 2011-2012 membership year to sell cookies.
- You **MUST** sign the permission slip and return it to the troop leader before taking orders.
- Your daughter **MUST** have proper adult supervision while selling.
- Once cookies are issued, you and your daughter are responsible for all of the cookies and/or money.
- Cookies **CANNOT** be returned.
- Your daughter must turn the money in on time.
- Cookies are \$3.50 per package.

No cookie sales before January 1, 2012. See your troop leader about Cookie Booth opportunities in your community.
