1. Window Paint Your Car | _____ (initial)

Show your Girl Scout pride! Use car window paint to draw a Girl Scout trefoil or write fun things like "We love Girl Scouts!," "GEMS bound!," "Girls <3 STEM", Girl Scout Road Trip!" or "Girl Scout Ambassadors rock!"

2. Learn How to Pump Gas | _____ (initial)

Ask a troop leader or parent to show you how to pump gas. (Note: Children under licensed driving age should not operate the pump but may observe.)
